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The SPSM® Certification Option

Today's typical purchasing and supply management team is a very polarized group from many perspectives: from Generation Y-age people to imminent retirees; high school grads to MBA's; career purchasers to castoffs from other departments; individuals with decades of experience to newbies; and individuals who focus mostly on tactical duties to individuals who focus strictly on strategic duties.

Such diversity can often lead to problems, such as:

- Inconsistent results
- Unevenly distributed workloads
- Lack of independence
- Lack of unity
- Communication breakdowns

Successful purchasing and supply management departments are employing several strategies to overcome these challenges.
