### F019 – Caring for the Cancer Patient: Challenging Cases From Inpatient and Outpatient Oncodermatology Consultative Services 1-3 p.m. | Friday, March 8 *Room 25B*

Dermatologic issues are one of the most common complications in patients undergoing cancer therapy. Knowledge of mucocutaneous toxicities to chemotherapy, immunotherapy, and radiation, neoplasms in cancer patients (particularly cutaneous metastases), paraneoplastic syndromes, complications of stem cell transplant, and infectious diseases of the immunosuppressed is critical in distinguishing the numerous dermatologic conditions that can arise in a patient undergoing cancer treatment. This session covers these key topics in the field of oncodermatology through illustrative and challenging cases seen at different academic cancer centers to enhance the knowledge of dermatologists, residents, and other practitioners caring for cancer patients.

### S012 – Gross and Microscopic Symposium

### 1-5 p.m. | Friday, March 8 *Room 4*

Two-day symposium covers the gamut of clinical dermatology, predicated on clinical/pathological correlation, with attention to new and interesting observations. Presentations are grouped into several clinical categories allowing attendees to focus on particular conditions/entities. ### U037 – Inpatient Dermatology From Horses to Zebras: Lessons Learned at an Academic Hospital 7:30-8:30 a.m. | Saturday, March 9 *Room 30D*

The role of the astute dermatologist in recognizing cutaneous signs in the hospitalized patient and coordinating interdisciplinary care makes a significant difference in prognosis and management. In a case-based format, we will review a subset of dermatologic emergencies, routine, and unusual inpatient consultations. This session is targeted to dermatology residents, general dermatologists, and dermatologists who see hospital consults.

Fox Award (formerly the Stelwagon Award) is given to the presenters of the most outstanding clinical and laboratory research. This \$3,500 cash award is granted by the American Academy of Dermatology through an endowment created by Dr. Fox and is split evenly between the top award recipients in both the clinical and basic science abstract categories.

### U001 – Simple Tricks and Practical Tips To Optimize the Surgical Experience for You and Your Patients 7:30-8:30 a.m. | Friday, March 8

*Room 31B* This session focuses on surgical tips for the beginner and reminders for the expert. It is filled with practical and simple pearls to enhance the surgical experience, including perioperative preparation, basic excision, suture techniques, laser safety, nail surgery, and post-operative complication prevention. This one-hour session provides you with high yield tips to improve the surgical experience for you and your patients.

### U012 – Bread n' Butter With a Side of Nutella: Short n' Sweet, High-Yield Updates on Management of Bread n' Butter Dermatologic Diseases

#### 7:30-8:30 a.m. | Friday, March 8 *Room 7B*

This session reviews the newest evidence-based treatment(s) for common dermatologic diseases, including warts, itch, blistering diseases, psoriasis, as well as updates in dermatopathology in diagnosis of diseases such as melanoma. Practicing dermatologists often do not have time to keep up with the latest evidence in clinical management. This session includes five high-impact, high-yield, "short n' sweet" updates in management of diseases that dermatologists most commonly encounter.

### F001 – Managing Office Politics of Physicians, Patients, and Personnel: Pick Your Poison

9-11 a.m. | Friday, March 8 *Room 26*A

The present economics of office/ hospital practice may have allowed for

the insidious onset of seemingly out of control burnout, a toxic environment, difficult people and situations threatening one's personal ethics and joy of practice. Patients are treated as customers and healthy employee relations threatened by harassment claims and weaponized in social media. This interactive session will review scenarios dealing with management and navigation of the current state of office/hospital politics, focusing on the pitfalls and risks to dermatologists, their staff, and patients. Participants will be given many practical strategies that can be immediately employed to reduce stress.

### S004 – Hot Topics

The symposium addresses those hot topics established by registrant consensus, a true reflection of member concerns and interests. Recognized experts from around the world discuss the most current scientific evidence regarding onychomycosis, nail unit psoriasis, nail unit lichen planus, trachyonychia, nail unit melanoma, nail disorders in skin of color patients, onycholysis, paronychia, as well as others. Instructive nail cases are also included.

#### S031 – Therapeutic Hotline

This session reviews new and emerging therapeutic options for managing patients with psoriasis, melanoma, actinic keratoses, acne, rosacea, dyspigmentation, hair diseases, rare diseases, non-melanoma skin cancer, and so much more. The newest and what's hot in dermatology ranging from medical to cosmetic to surgical dermatology will be addressed, and in one 3-hour session, virtually the entire spectrum of dermatology will be covered. ### F056 – Dermoscopy for the Non-Dermoscopist

Novice dermoscopists will be taught recognizable dermoscopic patterns to

assist in the diagnosis of pigmented lesions. We will discuss a simple pattern recognition system to be incorporated into routine dermatologic practice. The session includes dermoscopy of special sites, especially the face and acral surfaces. Participants will be shown unknown cases throughout the session for self-assessment, and the approach to diagnosis of these cases will be reviewed. By incorporating dermoscopy into everyday practice, participants will be able to improve their diagnostic accuracy in detecting melanoma and other skin cancers.

### F054 – Putting Technology to Work for You and Your Patients: Augmented Intelligence and Its Role in Enhancing the Practice of Dermatology

### 1-3 p.m. | Saturday, March 9 *Room 24C*

This session is directed at clinicians seeking to further understand the current state and future potential of technology, including Al/Aul, in patient care.
